


An Inseparable Bond Forged By Trust, Inspiration & Achievement

"The Sisterhood of Radcliffe" is a 10-episode podcast series that features the inspirational stories of a group of extraordinary Black women who forged an inseparable bond more than 40 years ago that began as incoming freshmen at Harvard University's Radcliffe College in 1975.

Together, these women, who arrived at Harvard as teenagers during one of the most racially turbulent periods in American history, overcame the challenges and pressures that come with attending one of the world's most prestigious universities, and went on to build accomplished careers, while maintaining their bonds of sisterhood.

"The Sisterhood of Radcliffe" podcast series offers an intimate look into the lives and career paths of each of these amazing women, detailing the challenges that they faced before, during and after attending Harvard, with hopes that their words will inspire young people about the importance of academic achievement, social interaction, networking and mentorship.



"The Sisterhood of Radcliffe" is a podcast series designed to inspire and mentor young women by showcasing inspiring stories and providing insights on the importance of education, social interaction and mentorship.

Presented as a podcast series "The Sisterhood of Radcliffe" is a Production of The Alzenia Project, a 501c3 organization whose vision is to offer "an inclusive environment in which young women—particularly women of color—can achieve increased educational access, and personal and professional growth."





The premiere season of "The Sisterhood of Radcliffe" will consist of ten (10) podcasts, each running between 30-40 minutes.

Each of the first eight (8) podcasts will highlight one of the Radcliffe "sisters," and will feature in-depth interviews and comments from the Featured Guest, plus former classmates and career associates.

Each of the final two podcasts will be broadcast live online and will feature a celebrity host and a group of 3-4 women from "The Sisterhood of Radcliffe" all sharing reflections about their experiences in a group setting.




Gina's brilliant insight and activism has positively affected the lives of countless communities and has helped to create a healthier pathway for Americans nationwide.




